#### Unusual driving laws examples, including, but not limited to:

It is illegal to run out of gas in a congested district in Youngstown, Ohio.

In University City, Missouri, it is illegal to honk someone else's horn.

It is illegal to honk your horn near a sandwich shop or cold beverage stand after 9pm in Little Rock, Arkansas.

In Marietta, Georgia, it is legal to spit from a truck, but if you do it from a car or a bus its illegal.

Even when responding to a call, fire trucks in New Britain, Connecticut, are not allowed to travel faster than 25 mph.

Alabama is located at the bottom of the US map, slightly to the right. It is between Mississippi and Georgia.

The most common cause of car accidents is distracted driving. This includes anything that distracts a driver from the road and includes looking at cell phones and eating food.

Answers might explain how pedestrians need to make sure they make it clear they want to cross and drivers need to be aware of pedestrians when approaching a zebra crossing.



0 Remember the clue: think about the double E!

Get this and vou will crack the answer!

TEN = 6

NEST = 10

Well the clue should have helped. Let's take a look:

TEE = 4

T can not be 1 because EE can not add up to 3.

T can not be three because EE can not add up to 1. So T must be 2.

If T is 2 then E must be 1 to make TEE add up to 4.

If T is 2 and E is 1, then N must be 3. (ten = 6)

This means S must be 4 to make NEST add up to 10.

So TENTS = 2 + 1 + 3 + 2 + 4 = 12


