Make a Dinosaur Fossil

Science Experiment

Method

- 1. Mix the flour, coffee grounds, salt, sand, and water together.
- 2. Form the mixture into round, flat balls large enough to fit the dinosaur toys.
- Press a dinosaur toy firmly into each ball then carefully remove it to reveal an impression.
- Place the balls on a cookie sheet lined with waxed paper and bake for 20 minutes.
- 5. Leave to cool.
- 6. Allow the children to play with the fossils. Can they match the fossil to the toy it was made with?



You will need:

- 175g plain flour
- 125g used ground coffee
- 60g salt
- 30g sand
- 240ml water
- Small plastic dinosaur toys
- Baking tray
- Baking paper
- Oven set to 150°C



Dinosaur Story.

Write an imaginative story about a dinosaur.

Remember to include a beginning (where your main characters are introduced with the setting), middle (where something goes wrong) and an ending (where the problem gets solved). As you write your story remember to include:

- Capital letters for the beginning of sentences and names
- Full stops
- Finger spaces
- Use your phonics to spell words
- Adjectives to make your story more interesting e.g. the purple, short, bad-tempered dinosaur
- Conjunctions to link ideas e.g. but, because, and, or

There is a story mountain attached to the next slide to help plan your story.
