30 cakes are arranged in an array. Some of the cakes are hidden.



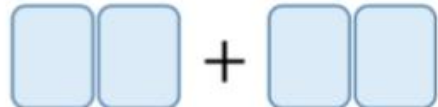
How many cakes are hidden?

$$10 \times 2 = 5 \times \text{blue circle}$$

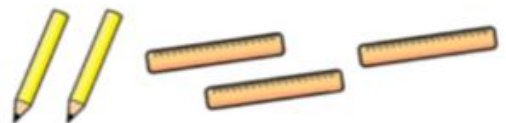
$$10 + 2 = 5 + \text{orange triangle}$$

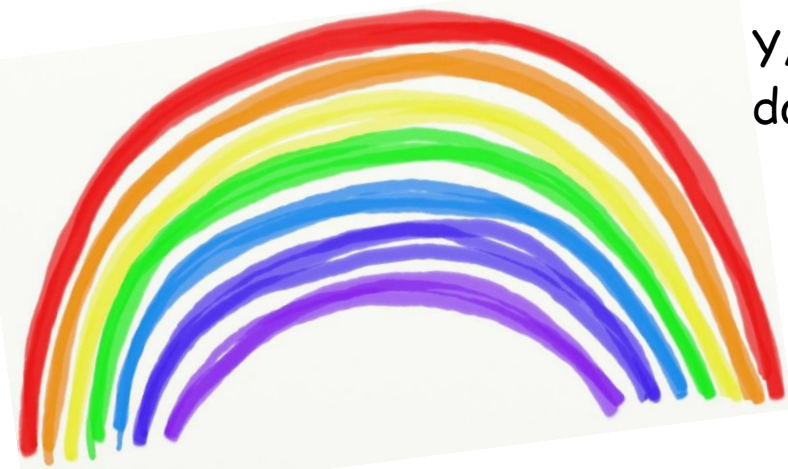
Examples of adjectives which could be written:
