This topic will take the children around the world to learn about the seven continents and five oceans. We will study a range a foods, cultures and traditions.










Castles and Dragons

dragons.










At Home with History

During this topic we will introduce the children to a selection of famous inventors whose inventions shaped the way that we lived today, as well as those who are closer to home. We will look at our local area, including Howley Grange Primary School to see how it has changed over time.







Forest School

Forest School will be led by Mr Yates and it will be taught over a course of three afternoon sessions



P.E

- Outdoor P.E will be on a Tuesday afternoon with class teachers.
- Please can the children wear a red T-shirt and black shorts/skirt and tracksuit. Trainers will also be required.
- Outdoor P.E will continue to be taught by Stuart How and the Your Sport team. Our session will be on Thursday morning. Please remember your child will come to school in their P.E kit. All jewellery must be removed on both days.





Just as in Year 1, children can bring in their own <u>healthy</u> snack from home or have fruit from school at break times.

Children will need their own named water bottle, which can be kept in the classroom all week and will be sent home on a Friday to be washed.

Children do have access to fresh water every day in each classroom.



As your child enters Year 2 they will continue to be assessed against the National Curriculum.

At the end of Year 2 your child will also be assessed against the Interim Assessment Framework.

As in Year 1, information about your child's progress is also assessed on a daily basis by their class teachers.

Children will be taking their phonics check after the Autumn half term.



Support at home ...

<u>**Reading:**</u> On a Monday, Wednesday and a Friday your child will have the opportunity to change their reading book. A tray will be provided near the outer door for your child to put their completed book in. Please ensure as parents you have commented on your child's reading, before their book can be changed. Thank you. Books will need to be quarantined for 72 hours before being redistributed.

<u>Homework:</u> Homework will be given out on a Friday and collected in on a Monday. We believe that homework is a vital part of the curriculum and it should be used to extend and consolidate all children's learning. The children gain most from this when supported by you.

<u>Spellings</u>: Spellings will be issued each Friday and the children will be tested on the following Friday. Please ensure your child has their spelling book in their bag every Friday.
