## Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium is an allocation of additional funding provided to schools to support specific groups of children who are vulnerable to possible underachievement. These include pupils who are entitled to free school meals, those looked after by the local authority and children of armed service personnel. The intended effect of this funding is to accelerate progress and raise attainment.

All schools are required to report on the amount of funding received, how this is being used, and the impact of any work done.

In the 2015/16 academic year Howley Grange Primary School received £67, 090 in Pupil Premium funding.

Increasing rates of progress for FSM across the school. Rates of progress for all pupils is line with typical or above.
